What is the problem?

Third country national (TCN) women face significant barriers when accessing vocational training and entering the job market, hindering their integration and potential.

2 What are the reasons and causes?

The barriers faced by TCN women are often complex and stem from multiple root causes. These include language barriers, cultural differences, discriminative systems, negative attitudes towards immigrants, lack of coordination among relevant actors, and many more.


Which approach should we take?
